2. Principal's Report

Jenny Seto-Vanderlip introduced herself and told us about her background: After a career in banking, she moved into teaching. She has been the principal for ASPS for the last three years. She has three adult children. She recognizes that it will be a challenge this year bringing the two campuses together, during this time of ongoing change. She will be based in the south site (former ASPS building) and Caitlin Evans, vice-principal, will be based in the north site (former Fessenden building). The two sites will still have some separation – for instance they are working from two separate budgets.

Some updates and useful info:

- Renovations are ongoing; line painting and sod is being laid
- Basketball nets are going up, Hopscotch, 4 Square lines will go in soon.
- Still some mechanical systems to be completed
- Crosswalk lines will be repainted
- New sidewalk is now completed and the fence has been removed in response to parents' concerns
- Waiting to hear if speed bumps are being redone
- Neither gym is large enough to accommodate full school population, so each site will have its own assemblies in respective gyms
- Pizza will be available and delivered to both sites
- They will have a student advisory group in order to encourage student voices in planning process
- Grade 6 students will do a mini-rotary that will allow them to take advantage of the Fitness and Instrumental music programs
- Monthly assemblies are open to parents
- Buses There will always be a supervisory adult present. Currently, all buses are leaving by 4:15pm. Recognizes this is tough on students. There is a driver shortage, hopefully this situation will improve

- Still waiting for the Frank Panabaker website to get up and running; should be next
 week; reminder to parents to check out teacher blogs, twitter, agendas, and some paper
 announcements for news and updates
- Kindergarten reorganization is underway. They will be opening a fourth class for 14 kids which will have just one teacher. All the parents will be notified tomorrow
- Design a mascot opportunity for all kids; submissions need to come in by Oct. 11
- Open House is Oct 3; Volunteer session is 5-5:30; all volunteers need a valid police check, done every 3 years
