School Organization 2017-18

We will have a number of combined classes next year. There are a number of myths related to combined classes, such as the students in the lower grades are the strong academically and the students in the higher grade are not. We will not create classes that reflect this myth. We create classes that are diverse and balanced.

For parents concerned about the impact of having their child in a combined class, here are some key research findings (Lataille-Démoré, 2007) related to combined classes:

- ♦ Students in combined grade classrooms achieve as well academically as those in single grade classrooms.
- Students appear to benefit from the spirit of co-operation and mutual help that exists in these settings.
- Whole-class strategies such as explicit instruction, co-operative learning and subject integration support improved learning in combined grade classrooms.
