### Important Updates

#### WEATHER

With the cooler weather fast approaching, please make sure your child is dressed for the weather conditions (e.g., hats, mitts, warm jacket, neck warmer). Our students are outside during entry time and 20 minutes during outdoor break. Sometimes students will also be outside for short periods of time during Daily Physical Activity time. Students will stay inside if there is a cold weather alert or temperatures are around -15 to -20 degrees celcius or colder with the wind chill.

#### SNOW CLEARING

Staff from the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board will clear, salt and/or sand the following area:

- The walkways around the school
- An area outside of entrances and Fire Exit Doors
- Front Entrance



When there is an accumulation of 5 cm of snow, parking lots and sidewalks are plowed by approved contractors arranged through Facilities Management. General salting and sanding of the parking lot is also done by contracted staff prior to the commencement of the school day when deemed necessary

by the Facility Management staff. Head Caretakers may salt or sand isolated areas on the parking lot and front entrance on an as needed basis. Playgrounds will not be plowed or otherwise cleared. Head Caretakers will check the condition of the grounds early in the morning and during the school day to sand and/or salt isolated slippery areas that may occur due to changing temperatures. Students should take extra caution when walking onto the school grounds when conditions are slippery.

## **TECHNOLOGY**

Students may bring their own devices to school (e.g., cell phone, ipad) at their own risk. Please keep in mind that the school is not responsible for damaged, stolen or lost devices. If students are not using their device for instructional purposes, we ask students to keep their device locked in their locker. Students are not permitted to be on personal devices during school hours without teacher supervision. Please speak to your child about these routines.
