Gatestone School Reorganization – First Day October 4th

Each fall, HWDSB reviews elementary student enrolment in schools, and reorganizes staffing if actual enrolment differs from the spring projections. It is normal for student enrolment to fluctuate from spring to fall. This year, the fall reorganization is more widespread due to the in-person/remote option for students and the ongoing need to meet provincial class size requirements.

Students should have received a letter of their class placement and teacher on Friday, October 1st. Kindergarten students were not impacted in the reorganization and our Grade 7A, 7/8A, 8A, 8B classes remain the same with a few additional students. Students in these classes will not have received a letter.

Students that have experienced a change in teacher or class placement will begin in their new class on Monday, October 4th. Our educators will work with students through this change to ensure success.

Given the many protocols the school must adhere to when building classes during this reorganization, the school is not able to move students into different classrooms or with different educators than assigned. All of our classes are currently at full capacity.

We understand some students will have little to no worries about change while other students may need time to adjust. Many students have built connections with peers over this past month and it may be hard to part with some friends or a particular teacher. If your child is experiencing some worry or anxiety about change, I kindly request you give your child a chance to adjust to their new environment. Validate how your child is feeling and remind them that the educators will be supportive in their feelings about change. It is often the case that after a few weeks in a new classroom environment, students form valuable connections with peers and educators and begin to thrive.

Walk to School

Gatestone is a "walking school". Students live within a walking distance from the school and therefore are encouraged to walk to school with parents or peers rather than be driven by vehicle. A school bus is the exemption here.

Benefits of Walking to and from School

- Improved safety on our community streets
- Less congestion and pollution near the school
- Walking provides time for mindfulness and self-reflection
- Walking with a peer provides time for peer connection
- Exercise feeling healthier and energized for school
- Adding more steps to your day

This week while walking to and from school with a caregiver or peer, try playing a game of scavenger hunt. Create clues of something you see and have your partner guess what the object/landmark may be.


