Weekly Updates

Entry and Dismissal

Entry

Our direct entry will begin at 9:10AM starting April 4th. Supervision at the school begins at 9AM. Please do not send your child to school before 9AM as our playground/field area is closed and supervision is not available before 9AM. We want to ensure safety for all.

Our entry bell will ring at 9:10AM in which students will line up and begin entering the building at their regular assigned entry doors (Where students currently enter in the morning).

Students should be arriving at school between 9AM and 9:15AM so they are on time for class. We will begin entering the school by 9:10AM to limit traffic on the blacktop area.

Parents with students in Grades 3 and up, we request your "goodbyes" for the morning are shared at any of the main gates or front sidewalk to limit morning traffic in the school ground area. Parents with children in Kindergarten to Grade 2, please continue to drop your child off at the

gate/walkways/on blacktop. Due to bus traffic in the front Kindergarten area and student traffic on blacktop and walkways, we ask that after drop off parents please say "goodbyes" and leave school grounds. We always welcome our families, however there is high traffic during entry so this process will help keep our school grounds safe for traffic flow as families arrive at different times between 9AM-9:15AM. Supervision is assigned to all areas of our school grounds at entry and dismissal for student safety.

We understand all families have special circumstances arriving to school. When able, we appreciate if families can have their children ready to enter our school no later than 9:15AM. This helps prepare our students and staff to start the day off ready for learning and limits students missing out on any important instruction during our first instructional period of the day.

Dismissal

Our dismissal routines continue to remain the same. We appreciate parents of older students waiting near gates or walkways for pick up to limit traffic.

We ask parents do not pick up their children at our **parking lot gate**. Our parking lot is closed for parent traffic during 3:35PM-3:50PM due to bus, taxi and Umbrella Care traffic. We do not encourage students to be walking through our parking lot during these high traffic times. Parents that can only drive should park on adjacent streets near the school and meet their child at one of our front walkways or on our blacktop for our younger students. We appreciate your support here to help maintain safe and smooth dismissals for all.
