CC:ROSE invites all of the HWDSB community to join them in honouring and respecting the ongoing truth telling of Canada's Residential School Survivors, those who were taken and those who didn't come home.

The buttons will be distributed prior to May 28, 2022, which is the one-year mark since the initial report broke of the Kamloops, British Columbia ground search.

The proceeds of the campaign will be donated to Indigenous groups and organizations that support the truth telling and healing for Survivor's, their families and communities. As an Indigenous student group, this is how we are working towards helping to heal ourselves and our communities in the spirit of reconciliation. We invite you to join us in this meaningful work.

Previous Updates

Personal Devices at School

Students over the past few weeks have been inquiring about school and ministry policies regarding the use of personal devices at school. Below is a link to the Ministry Policy regarding Personal Mobile Devices for families to review when students are choosing to bring personal devices to school (e.g., cell phone, own ipad/lap top, gaming devices).

When can my child use a personal mobile device in the classroom?

The use of personal mobile devices is permitted during instructional time under the following circumstances:

- For educational purposes, as directed by the educator in the classroom
- For health and medical purposes
- To support special educational needs

Circumstances and situations may look different for each individual student. Educators will collaborate with families and students to create any necessary plans when accommodations are required. This will ensure there is a common understanding of the regulations with all parties involved. Should you have further questions regarding the use of personal devices in schools, please connect with your child's homeroom teacher or our main office.

During our nutrition breaks, homeroom teachers are responsible for sharing guidelines of appropriate activities/games during this time. Should a student need to contact a parent during school hours, including nutrition breaks, students are encouraged to connect through our main office. During outdoor time, we encourage our students to get active or enjoy this time socializing with their peers. Educators supervising may ask students to put their personal devices away (if outside with them) so they can enjoy more active play with peers or have more time to socialize with peers. Circumstances may look different depending on the individual student and their needs.

Students using a personal mobile device at school at any time (e.g., class time, nutrition break, before/after school) must adhere to HWDSB code of conduct. Educators and Administrators will follow progressive discipline if there are concerns students are not adhering to the HWDSB code of conduct.

<u>Code of Conduct Procedure</u>

Grade 8: Commencement

Commencement will take place on the evening of June 21st. The celebration will begin around 5PM in the school gymnasium for our Grade 8 students, families and Gatestone staff. There will be a 30min ceremony to honour our graduates and hear from our valedictorians. Then students and families will rotate through various interactive stations (e.g., family photographs, treats in library, viewing of video grad pages, picking up awards/composites etc.) before students head off to the Grand Olympia to celebrate with their friends. More details will be shared with our Grade 8 families in the upcoming weeks.

Ramadan

This year, the Month of Ramadan begins on the evening of April 2 and ends on the evening of May 1, 2022. This is the holiest month in the Islamic year and begins at the sighting of the new moon.

During Ramadan, the school will provide appropriate accommodations for students that may include exemption from physical activities, spaces for prayer, flexibility in test and assignment schedules and

Continuing Education – Summer Series

1. Reach Ahead CREDIT program – Grade 8 Students

Current Grade 8's transitioning to Grade 9 can earn a half credit or a full credit before starting High School. We are offering Civics and Careers courses to all Grade 8's who will transition to Grade 9 in the fall. These open level half-credit courses can be taken individually (9 days) or in combination (18 days). This is the **only credit program available to students reaching ahead before grade 9.** These courses will be offered On-Line.

2. Summer Literacy and Numeracy Skill Builder Programs



The non-credit programs are available to students **currently in** Grades 6 & 7 (Elementary) and Grades 8-12 (Secondary). The purpose of these programs is to enrich and develop Literacy and Numeracy skills. In 2022, we are excited to offer a variety of programs, some In-Person and some On-line including:

- Skill Builder Literacy Programs (fully on-line)
- Skill Builder Math Programs (fully on-line)
- Fractions Program (fully on-line)
- Art & Literacy (both in-person and on-line options available)
- Coding & Literacy (or Numeracy) (fully on-line)
- Basketball and Literacy (in-person)
- Soccer and Literacy (in-person)

On-Line programs will include a 2-hour real time/synchronous online lesson each day and fun activities for the students to complete beyond the lesson time. In-Person programs will be 3 hours long.

3. International Languages Elementary (IILE) Program

Students currently in Grades Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8 are eligible to participate. The IILE program exists to educate our students with a new language and/or strengthen their skills in the language(s) of their choice. Students will learn to speak, listen, read, and write in these lessons, as well as have assigned homework, and opportunity to participate in class. IILE Classes include:

- On-line programs 1.5-hour synchronous lesson per day (over MS Teams) in addition to assigned work **or**
- In-Person programs 2.5 hours of In-Person instruction per day

The summer program runs from July 4 to 29 (Mon-Fri). Learning a language is a valuable skill and experience that our students can carry with them as they continue with their education for years to come.

We will have additional information available over the coming days about our ESL Literacy and Learning Strategies programs - registration for ESL Literacy and Learning Strategies is supported by school staff to ensure participants meet eligibility requirements.

PLEASE NOTE: Students may only attend one program at a time, ex. Reach Ahead in July and a Skill Builder July program cannot be taken together, however students can take Reach Ahead in July and a Skill Builder Program in August.
