Gatestone Drive Closures Week of Nov. 7-11

It would be best to access Gatestone Drive through Second Street area or through Highbury Drive.

We encourage families within walking distance to the school to please walk with your child. This will improve safety and limit congestion near the school.

Treaties Recognition Week Nov. 7-11

What is Treaties Recognition Week?

In 2018, the Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation (MIRR) announced that Ontario has designated the first full week of November as Treaties Recognition Week. The MIRR Treaty Awareness campaign is an opportunity to teach and learn about historic agreements, contributions, cultures and perspectives of Indigenous Peoples as the original stewards of this land and of the responsibilities that Canadians have in their role as treaty partners.

What is a Treaty?

A treaty is a legally binding nation to nation agreement (for example – Indigenous Nations and Crown) that sets out the rights, responsibilities, and relationships between the Indigenous Nations of these lands, and the federal and provincial governments on behalf of the Crown. Treaties can only be made between nations and Indigenous nations continue to practice the five pillars of nationhood criteria/status which include: language, distinct culture, way of practicing a common belief system

(ceremony), sovereign form of governance, and land/territory. Treaty agreements between Indigenous Nations and the Crown were based on eternal peace, friendship, and respect.

Transgender Days of Significance

November has historically been a month where HWDSB recognizes International Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDOR), which takes place annually on November 20th. TDOR is a day to remember and mourn transgender people both locally and globally that have been lost to acts of violence and transphobia. However, this year, the HWDSB Equity team is endeavouring to provide more resources for our educators about the different days of significance that also take place in November to celebrate transgender students and their families or seek to increase visibility and provide awareness and education about transgender, nonbinary, and gender diverse individuals.

Trans Parent Day - November 6th, 2022 First established in 2009, this day takes place on the first Sunday of November. It was created for children to celebrate their transgender parent(s). Currently this day has evolved into a celebration of transgender families with either transgender parent(s) and/or transgender children. #LOVEISLOVE.

Week - November 13th - November 19th, 2022 Transgender Awareness Week is a celebration leading up to Transgender Day of Remembrance. This week is an opportunity to highlight transgender, nonbinary, and gender diverse individuals and communities and advocate for authenticity and visibility. It is a chance to let all students see themselves in our classrooms and schools. #TRANSVISIBILITY #WontBeErased.
