Welcome Back Eagles!

We have had a great return of students to in-class learning at G. L. Armstrong!

Our outside lines are working really well in keeping our students socially distanced as they await entry in the morning, at Nutrition Breaks and at the end of the day. Each class also has a section of the yard designated for them for nutrition break. These cohort areas allow us to keep students with the same group should we need to do any contact tracing. In the event of rain, when students arrive, they will go right into the building and walk directly to their classrooms.

Our school has many signs posted to help us to remember the rules when indoors. These include wearing masks, hand hygiene, maintaining social distance, reporting if you feel unwell, staying to the right hand side of the hallways and special spots on the floor for lining up. Hand sanitizer is available throughout the school. Caretaking is diligent about cleaning high touch surfaces many times throughout the day—door handles, washrooms, railings, and any rooms where a child has reported feeling ill during the day.

Each hallway area of the school has its own entry and exit doors so that lines do not cross when students are on the move.

We are so proud of our students, staff and families for the great job they are doing!

What Happens When a Student Feels Sick

Remember to screen your child before they come to school using the online screening tool at https://covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment/. Students who report not feeling well or exhibiting any symptoms of Covid-19 while at school will be removed from the classroom to an isolation room and families will be called to pick them up. Currently, the isolation room is near to the office so that we can monitor students who are waiting for pick-up

- Students who test negative for COVID-19 must isolate until they do not have a fever (without using medication) and without symptoms for 24 hours. Household contacts should continue to monitor for symptoms.
- Students who **test positive** for COVID-19 must remain in isolation and follow Hamilton Public Health Service guidance and cannot attend school for at least 14 days. Household contacts should self-isolate at home and follow public health guidelines.





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- Ill students **not tested** and given an **alternative diagnosis** by a health care provider, the individual is to isolate at home until without a fever (without the use of medication) and free of symptoms for at least 24 hours.
- Ill students, if **not tested**, must not return to school for 14 days from the start of symptoms and be without symptoms for at least 24 hours. Household contacts should monitor for symptoms.

Drop Off and Pick Up

Supervision on the playground begins at 8:25 am. There is NO supervision prior to that time so we ask that students not arrive prior to 8:25 am. Upon arrival, students are asked to move directly into line to wait for the bell. Parents will be asked to wait on the perimeter of the yard so that we can limit the number of contacts for our students as they wait in line to enter. Supervision at the end of the day will end at 3:15. School Buses continue to be at a shortage for drivers. So far our school's bus has not had a driver and therefore has not been available for students. We do not know when this situation will change so please continue to check the Student Transportation for information Hamilton Wentworth Website more at https://www.hamiltonschoolbus.ca/

The Hamilton By-Law officers do visit now and then so if you are driving your children to school **please park** where permitted. Mind the signs!

Visitors in the School

Thank-you to our families as we get used to the new routine of parents and visitors not being permitted into the school. This is for the safety of our students and staff. If you need to drop something off or pick up your child, please buzz the officer using the buzzer outside of the East 19th street entrance and someone from inside the school will help you out. Any students who are late will need to buzz and wait for someone to come to the door with hand sanitizer for entry.

Student Attendance

Attendance reporting is extremely important. If your child is going to be absent or late, please input this information into the Safe Arrival/Parent Portal app. If your child is required to leave school early, you will also need to enter that data into the system. A reminder that for students to attend school they must clear the daily medical screener questions each morning. Being on time is also important as one of the Office Administrators has to leave their desk to let students who are late in to the building.

Most of the information that you will be receiving from the school this year will be posted on the Parent Portal, the School website and the school Twitter account. This allows for a safe way to get information to our families homes without sending paper home. Please complete the beginning of the year forms that are currently available in the Parent Portal. Introducing Boomerang Lunches at GLA!
