- PALS (physical activity leaders in school) program have 25+ members in Grades 7/8. They were trained for 3 days on how to respond to situations. Had to sign contracts, with parents permission. New Business

Family engagement subcommittee has decided on activities that are already underway.

February: Design your own Playground (emailed out in Newsletter, posted online, flyers up on doors, hand outs at school) Mrs. Wardle will email the flyers out to their parents.

March: Poetry/Creative writing contest (theme tbd but will be communicated at the beginning of the month). Templates can be made for the younger grades whereas the older grades can be freestyle.

April: Community Scavenger Hunt. Much the same as last year but also adding a more challenging element for older kids to be more engaged. Similar to the BIAs Easter Bunny Hop where we have Eagles inside some locations that will get families into businesses and connecting to the Community.

May: 30k in May exercise challenge. Also like last year. We are going to test out various apps to see if there are any that will be easy and accessible to use. Teachers may be kicking it off in school and all participants – no matter what access – can participate/will be included.

- June: Trying to keep open in case there is a possibility that we may potentially be able to host an in person event by this point and if that is the case, we will strive to host an event for our families if that option is available to us.
- New Park: Tying into our first activity, the City has reached out for input. They want to connect with the Community. As of March 8th, a Community survey will be available online and that will be shared and communicated when it goes live. Mrs. Pauls has requested a virtual meeting with School Council and school staff so we will also make this date known. She has informed me that work will begin in July and the goal is to have it complete by the time school begins in September
- PRO GRANT: we have applied for a PRO Grant. It is between \$500 \$1000 to get parents involved. Layla Staats' film "Blood and Water" a story on the modern day impact of intergenerational trauma from Residential Schools, and the Journey of Reclamation to Traditional Teachings. Through Teams, show the movie and have a Q&A after. Focusing on parents but everyone is welcome to watch as it will create good dialogue and understanding. Waiting to hear back if grant approved. There is a performance of Layla Staats on the Concession St BIA website. Thanks Lisa!

Grad: last year, we used some of our money to create Grad bags for our graduates. It had cinch bags, rally towels, note pads and pencils. If grads will be missing out on past celebrations, we want to make a contribution to grads again. There is a chance that a ceremony will be possible, perhaps a dance. We will have to wait and see but suggestions on how we can make a difference for our grads would be appreciated. Please message me with any ideas
