**Blood and Water: a Story of
Reclamation**

This 22-minute film shares the story of Layla Staats, Mohawk Turtle Clan from Six Nations of the Grand River, on her path to reclaim her Mohawk identity. Staats is a generational survivor of residential schools. While her culture was taken from her, she works to reclaim it through her ancestral connection with water.

Following the screening, she will hold a 40-minute Q&A. The event will be both in-person and virtual*.
