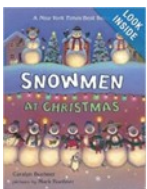
From Glenwood Library

With the holiday season approaching, here are some favourite picture books for the holiday season.

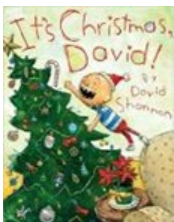
Book Shelf



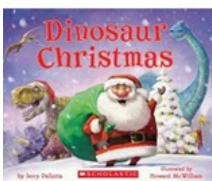
