EQAO Data:
Test scores are have been published and are going home with students. Grade 3 - Math 88% (at / above grade level) (44% board average) Reading 75% (66% board) Writing 83% (53% board)

> Grade 6 Math 30% (36% board) Reading 79% (77% board) Writing 73% (75% board)

Positive Space Group:

Rural Schools Budget

We have purchased sand for sandboxes, JK/SK, and materials for STEM project in grade 8 classes.

Additional allocation is in a board reserve - all rural schools can ask for access to it. There is currently \$4172 sitting in reserve

PA Day:

-universal design for learning, getting to know students. -staff had to create a learning plan for a particular student / profile. -opportunity to explore what strategies we are using in our classrooms and create purposeful instruction.

Q: Is there any information on the disconnect on the EQAO math results in grade 6? A: We are all still trying to figure out the new curriculum. This year was also the first year the test was all online. Everything was digital. The test itself looked very different than before. I think we need a few years to track the pattern.

Q: are students able to opt out of online test taking? A: don't know but I can find out.

Discussion re: bus loop / supervision / safety of children crossing Harvest Road Parent questions included: can we get a crossing guard? Who do we speak to at the board? Can someone come in to talk to the parent council about this? Can Paul Tut come to a meeting to address this?

The board is aware of the issues and is working with the city to resolve this matter. Our trustee has been invited to our council meetings.
