

Messenger vs WordPress

These are 2 different social media platforms supported by HWDSB. There seems to be some confusion as to their use and function at the school level. To clarify, Messenger is used by the principal to send messages to families via telephone (robocall), text or email. This function is most effective when used sparingly, yet strategically. Time sensitive information is most often communicated using Messenger. WordPress is the digital suite used to post information to our school website. This function can be accessed by both board and school staff. Families are encouraged to subscribe to the school webpage in order to receive board and site-specific updates. Also, please watch for information items posted to our digital sign.



Parking Lot Safety

Families are reminded to abide by all parking bylaws on school property. There are many signs directing drivers to operate their vehicles safely. Specifically, drivers are cautioned about idling their vehicles for extended periods of time. Idling is prohibited in the 'kiss and ride' area. The idea is to drop students off at the curb and continue driving out of the lot. Otherwise, the lot becomes overly congested and student safety is compromised.

As well, please do not park your vehicle by the curb and leave it unoccupied – even for a few minutes. Bylaw officers visit our site often because of the many complaints by neighbours and library patrons. Despite the parking challenges on site, we need to work together to ensure students enter and exit school property safely.
