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
Dear Families,

As a school, we do our best to keep families informed and up-to-date on current events. We aim to be timely in our messaging but technology is not always our friend. We use a variety of platforms to communicate to families, this newsletter being one of them. Please subscribe to our school and board webpages, update your information in the Parent Portal to receive Messenger emails and glance at the electronic sign out front of the school for a rotating list of current events. It's sometimes challenging to streamline the information but we try to appeal to as many families as possible by using various modes of communication.

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Greensville School is 1 of 25 HWDSB schools chosen to participate in a real-world problem-solving challenge, facilitated through an organization that leverages integrative thinking, I-Think Together. A group of 20 intermediate students have been chosen to participate in this 3-day challenge. Students will have an opportunity to share their thinking and present their ideas to the school community at a later date. Three lead educators are overseeing this work: Mrs. Kott, Mrs. Hawkins and Ms. Kiss.

The Challenge

We are coming to students because we trust their knowledge, experience and imagination to lead the path forward in HWDSB.

We know that belonging is necessary for learning. Why? Because pretending is exhausting. If their physical, mental and spiritual energy is spent trying to fit in, and pretending to be someone they are not, they don't have the physical, mental and spiritual energy for learning. Every student in every school has a right to learn and belong.

In October 2023, the HWDSB passed the Multi-Year Strategic Plan. Our mission is: Every student experiences a sense of belonging and engages in dynamic learning to reach their potential and build their own future. The way we get to this, is to go from words on the page to actions that school communities and the school board can take. We are coming to students with the question: <u>How might our school foster a sense of belonging for all students in the progression from elementary to high school?</u>

EQAO Results 2022-23 (School Level)

Our results are in line with pandemic recovery efforts and have been impacted by school year disruptions (i.e., teacher turnover, labour action). Writing scores have dipped in Grade 3, and Math scores continue to be an area of focus for both grades 3 and 6. Please keep in mind, EQAO results are only a snapshot of students' abilities. Classroom assessments, report card data, DRA (Diagnostic Reading Assessment), OWA (Ontario Writing Assessment) and other literacy/math screeners play an integral part of evaluating academics - some of which are specifically chosen by educators based on their student demographics. We recognize there are areas for improvement, and we will work towards that end through our staff professional development and annual school planning efforts, this year.

Grade 3 - At or Above Provincial Standard

Reading: 63% Writing: 50% Mathematics: 53%

Grade 6 – At or Above Provincial Standard

Reading: 82% Writing: 78% Mathematics: 39%

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SYNOPSIS:

The Primary and Junior Presentations entitled "Stick With The Truth 1.0" focus on the three truths about skin colour and on equipping students in an age-appropriate way to stick with those truths so as not to believe any lies about skin colour which cause harm.

The Intermediate presentation entitled "Colour Blind? Why Being 'Not Racist' Is Not Enough Anymore 1.0" has three objectives:

- to explain what racism is and isn't
- - to help students see how it connects to their lives
- to inspire them to become the opposite of racist for life
