# **HWDSB Math Achievement Action Plan**

Provincially, there has been a decrease in math scores and achievement over the past several years. The Ministry of Education identified 46 priority schools within our board. Greensville is not one of them. However, we do have work to do. HWDSB has created a Math Plan for 2023/2024 which

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will be implemented in the new year. Staff will engage in professional development and spend time actioning the 3 priority items within the plan:

- 1. Ensuring fidelity of curriculum implementation and use of instructional assessment practices with a proven track record of enhancing student achievement.
- 2. Engaging in ongoing learning to strengthen mathematics content knowledge for teaching.
- 3. Knowing the mathematics learning, and ensuring mathematical tasks, interventions and supports are relevant and responsive.
