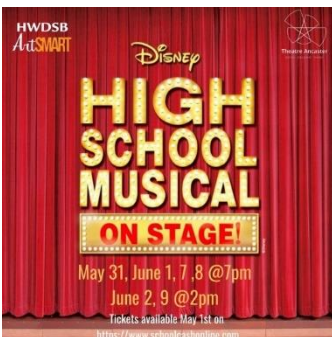

1848-2017

The original Greenville schoolhouse was modestly built in 1848 and included this one giant bell that rang out across the rural landscape. The bell could be heard from a kilometer away and marked the start of each school day. Despite many structural changes to the school over the years, the bell remained in place for 169 years.

The bell is an important symbol of yesteryear and a reminder that some relics are worth preserving.
