PPM 128 – Student Personal Devices: With the implementation of new legislation this year, the use of personal devices and access to social media in schools have been greatly impacted. Personal devices include phones, laptops, tablets, iPads and watches (ones that have data plans and allow students to use voice-to-text). All personal devices must be stored out of sight and silenced during the school day, unless with permission and under direct supervision of school staff. Overall, students have been responding well to the new rules with the exception of a few minor incidents. We are using a progressive discipline model that allows

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students some time and space to get used to these new ways of interacting with their devices. I would ask parents/caregivers to continue having conversations at home that support these new practices. We want students to be engaged, on task and fully present in their learning each day. For students using data enabled watches, students must use "school mode" at all times. This allows students to tell time and monitor their physical activity (counting steps) but restricts communication tools. If you need to contact your child throughout the day, please call the office for assistance. Parents should not be sending text messages or emails to their child during instructional hours. Thank you for your assistance. You play a huge part in how successful this legislation will be and the impact it will have on students.

<u>Classroom Allocation Update:</u> As was previously shared via Messenger to all families last week, Greensville will not be re-organizing classrooms this year. We are truly grateful to avoid student and staff shuffling, as well as the creation of new schedules and timetables. We remain status quo and now focus our energies on building stronger classroom communities and a sense of belonging for everyone.

<u>Parking Lot:</u> A friendly reminder to those who use our parking lot to do so safely and respectfully. Please read the signage and look at the painted symbols on the pavement to know which areas and spots are designated for visiting vehicles. There are many challenges with our parking situation but our priority remains safety. Unless you are in a designated parking spot, please do not exit your vehicle and leave it unattended for any reason.

<u>Dogs on School Property:</u> When bringing your dog to school, please remain at a distance from the playground fence. Some of our students are afraid of animals (specifically dogs). When dogs are rambunctious and barking and/or blocking the pathway for students to enter the playground from their bus, this complicates entry procedures. Please hold dogs on a short leash and consider using a mussel when in close proximity of children.

<u>Bussing:</u> This continues to be our biggest obstacle at Greensville this year. We are not the only school burdened by a driver shortage as there are 18 open routes across HWDSB. I am in regular contact with the bus company and student transportation services for updates. HWDSB is aware of these challenges. Unfortunately, there are no easy solutions that are equitable for all families being impacted. I continue to advocate for Greensville; however, the driver shortage is beyond my sphere of influence. I can only guarantee that there will be transportation (albeit late) and adult supervision of students when we encounter a delayed route. Please continue to check the bus app for updates. I have requested that route delays be posted in a timelier manner, given our early dismissal.
