PPM 128 – Student Personal Devices: As an update, we continue to experience overall success with students and their use of personal devices. Thank you for encouraging students to follow classroom/school rules so that we can continue to operate in the best interest of students and their learning.

EQAO Results – 2023/24: Last year's results have been released to the public and are available on their website. A brief synopsis of our school's results can be found in the table below. Part of our School Improvement Plan is to address our Junior math scores. While EQAO is only a snapshot of students' skills, it is still a viable data set to review academic gaps and improvement efforts.

Parking Lot & Playground Additions: Please note, we have added **No Parking** to an area of the lot that was often mistaken for temporary parking. Parking in the hatch-marked area creates blind spots for other drivers and students walking through the lot. Please do not park in that area, especially now that it is clearly marked. The playground had its bus circles refreshed so now student bus lines are clearly defined.
