# As we return on Monday, February 8<sup>th</sup> just a few reminders:

# **Device Return:**

Please return all HWDSB devices, including cubes and cords, in a Ziploc bag with the student's first and last name and class number on Monday, February 8<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Transportation:**

#### Masking:

Students will continue to wear masks (unless you have a <u>mask exemption</u>), however, a new mandate requires students to wear masks during outdoor activities where physical distance cannot be maintained. For this reason, we are asking that you pack a couple of masks each day for your child so that they can replace masks that become wet or frozen in cold weather. Neck warmers and scarves do not replace a mask as they do not form a seal around the nose and mouth and may not be made of the recommended material.





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# Winter Clothing:

Please label all your child's winter clothing so that it can be easily returned. Students all have their own hook or locker for storing winter clothing and indoor shoes that can be left at school.

### **Cohort Squares**

Unfortunately sometime over the last several weeks our flags that were being used to cohort our classes were removed from our field. This is very disappointing as we can no longer determine where each cohort square is located. The board and public health have made it very clear that now, more than ever, we must remain vigilant and keep our students cohorted. With it being so cold, we are unable to place the flags into the frozen ground. We have also tried spray painting the snow, but it wasn't effective. With coming back earlier than anticipated we have not yet received the supplies we need to cohort the field. We have become very creative and will be using orange buckets filled with a sand bag and flag to distinguish our cohort squares, just like other HWDSB schools neighbouring us.

### **Morning Entry**

Until further notice we will be using our inclement weather entry from 8:20 to 8:35 a.m. Students are to use their designated door and will proceed to their classroom.

#### **Nutrition Breaks**

For a few days this week, during nutrition breaks students will remain indoors for the entire 40 minutes. Teachers will ensure that students receive two 20-minute outdoor DPA times during the day so that our students can get outside. When going outside, staff will ensure we maintain physical distance between class cohort and others while we wait to be able to set up our cohort squares.

**Please Note:** Once we get our cohort squares back, we are considering flipping the nutrition break so students eat first and then go outside in order to minimize disruptions to instruction and to maximize more outside time for staff who wish to have outdoor DPA immediately after nutrition break, since students will already be dressed in their winter clothing. More information will be shared in the coming days.

#### Dismissal:

Until further notice we will be using our inclement weather dismissal. When the bell goes, students, maintaining physical distance, will exit using the door that is always used for entry/exit procedures. Bus students will report right to the gym. Aftercare students will go outside and meet up with the aftercare staff in their designated outdoor location. If we have bad weather, the aftercare students will line up on the left hand side of the hall, in front of the classroom used for the aftercare program.





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# **Congregating at School:**

Public health and the board are requesting that the number of adults entering school property be reduced. Where possible only one parent/caregiver should be dropping off and picking up students. It is recommended that students in grades 4 to 8 determine a designated pick-up location not on the blacktop area. For grades 1 to 3, we ask that parents not wait right at the doors but instead near the rock and fence areas. We also ask that parents and students not congregate on the playground before and after school. Please leave the premises as quickly as possible during both drop-off and pick-up. The playground area is supervised from 8:20 to 8:35 am and again from 2:55 to 3:10 pm by Guy Brown Staff.

#### **Daily COVID-19 Screening:**

It is vital that parents/guardians review this screening for COVID-19 symptoms daily before your child arrives at school. If you answer **Yes** to any questions, the student has failed the screening and must not attend school and you should contact Public Health at (905) 974-9848.
