 **Spooky Math Challenge: Pumpkin Patch Problems!** 

Grades 1–8 At-Home Activity

This week's math challenge invites students to explore math through a Halloween-themed adventure in a pumpkin patch! Families can work together to solve problems that grow in complexity depending on the grade level.

 **Materials Needed:**

- Paper and pencil
- Optional: small objects (candy, coins, LEGO, etc.) for counting or modeling
- Imagination!

 **Activity Instructions by Grade Group:**

Grades 1–2: Counting & Addition

Scenario: You're picking pumpkins for Halloween.

- You pick 3 small pumpkins and 4 big pumpkins.
- How many pumpkins do you have in total?
- If each small pumpkin costs \$2 and each big pumpkin costs \$4, how much do you spend?

Curriculum Links: Number sense, addition, skip counting, money.

Grades 3–4: Multiplication & Estimation

Scenario: You're helping decorate the haunted house.

- You hang 6 strings of lights. Each string has 8 lights.
- How many lights are there in total?
- Estimate how many candies you'll need if each of 12 trick-or-treaters gets about 5 candies.

Curriculum Links: Multiplication, estimation, problem solving.

Grades 5–6: Fractions & Area

Scenario: You're designing a spooky floor mat.

- The mat is 2 m long and 1.5 m wide. What is its area?
- You want to cover $\frac{3}{4}$ of the mat with spider web fabric. How much area will be covered?

Curriculum Links: Measurement, fractions, area.

Grades 7–8: Algebra & Proportional Reasoning

Scenario: You're planning a Halloween party.

- You have a budget of \$100. Decorations cost \$25, snacks cost \$3 per person, and games cost \$10.
- Write an equation to represent your spending.
- How many people can you invite without going over budget?

Curriculum Links: Algebraic reasoning, budgeting, linear equations.
