At-Home Writing Activity

"Describe Our Favorite Place"

Curriculum Connections:

- **Writing:** Use descriptive language to convey ideas clearly for a specific purpose and audience.
- Oral Communication: Discuss and brainstorm descriptive words with family members.
- **Reading:** Explore descriptive texts or examples for inspiration.

Learning Goals:

- Students will write a descriptive paragraph or short piece about a place that is meaningful to their family.
- Students will use sensory details (sight, sound, smell, touch, taste) and vivid adjectives to create imagery.
- Students will organize ideas logically and revise for clarity.

Instructions for Students and Families:

1. Pick a Place Together:

a. It could be your kitchen, backyard, a park, or even an imaginary dream location.

2. Brainstorm Sensory Details:

- a. Ask: What do we see? hear? smell? feel? taste?
- b. Write down words and phrases for each sense.
- c. Example: "The park smells like fresh grass and sounds like birds singing."

3. Create a Word Bank:

- a. Include adjectives, similes, and interesting verbs.
- b. Example: sparkling, cozy, smells like cinnamon, sounds like laughter.





4. Write Your Description:

- a. **Grades 1–3:** Write 4–6 sentences using at least 3 senses.
- b. **Grades 4–6:** Write a paragraph with a strong opening sentence and vivid details.
- c. **Grades 7–8:** Write a multi-paragraph description with figurative language (similes, metaphors) and a clear mood.

5. Add an Illustration or Photo:

a. Draw the place or take a picture to go with your writing.

6. Share and Reflect:

- a. Read your description aloud to your family.
- b. Ask: Does this make you feel like you're there?

Extension Ideas:

- Challenge: Add a short poem about the place using descriptive words.
- **Digital Option:** Create a slideshow with photos and captions describing the place.
- **Family Twist:** Each family member adds one sentence to make a collaborative description.
