

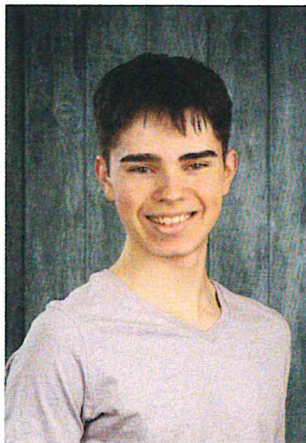

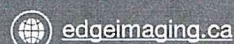

HOW TO USE YOUR NEW eID CARDS

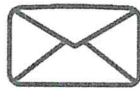
Convenient • Safe • Eco-Friendly

DOWNLOADING YOUR ID CARD

Downloading your new eID card is fast and easy! Simply sign in online with your school email address and tap the button to add the ID card to your smartphone wallet. No third-party app installation is required!

HOW WILL STUDENT EMAIL ADDRESSES BE USED?



Obtaining an eID card requires sharing student email addresses with Edge. Email addresses will be stored in compliance with CASL regulations and used for three things:

- Reminders in advance of photo day
- Notifications when the ID card is ready for download
- Notifications when portraits are available to be viewed online after photo day

IS IT SECURE?



Edge prioritizes and invests heavily in the security of student images and data; eID cards are no different.

- Data is fully encrypted and stored solely on Edge-managed systems located at an Edge-owned facility
- Full cybersecurity protocols and strategy in place
- Protocols meet and exceed PIPEDA, FIPPA and CASL requirements
