SCENT SAFE SCHOOL

Highview is a "scent safe" school due to numerous environmental allergies with staff and students. Please refrain from wearing strong perfumes, colognes, creams, etc. into the school.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

You may choose to officially join Council and become a voting member, an Executive member (nomination forms will be available at the meeting), or simply attend meetings to seek information and provide input.

School Councils play an important role in ensuring the success of all students and communicating student success to parents and community members. There is an enormous body of evidence that indicates a positive impact on student learning when parents are involved in their children's education.

School councils have a legislated role at their schools and are there to ensure the best possible education for students. Our school councils are comprised of democratically elected representatives of our parent community. Together, they:

focus on student learning and the best interest of all students,

- provide a forum through which parents and other members of school communities can contribute to improving student achievement and school performance,
- make recommendations to the school principal and the Board on any matter they see impacting accountability and academic excellence and;
- ♣ serve as a communication and information channel between the school and community

PICK UP AND DROP OFF OF STUDENTS

All Pick-ups and Drop-offs to Highview should occur on the side streets closest to the playground. This helps to reduce traffic along Queensdale East, and decrease congestion in the Front Hall of the School in the morning. Please remember that in the morning the Front Doors should not be used for entrance by students. Exiting through the Front Door in the afternoon is for Bus Lines only! Also, the Staff Parking Lot should not be used for pick up and drop offs. For the safety and security of all our students, staff and neighbours we ask that everyone please adhere to this.

CARETAKING

A special thank you to our Custodial staff who worked around the clock the last week of August (right up until the afternoon of Labour Day) to have everything washed, floors waxed and ready for students on Tuesday.

BUS INFORMATION

The central transportation department (HWSTS) designs the routes and stops to make the most effective use of the buses assigned to our school. Some stops may have been changed slightly, others have disappeared altogether. Some students may be grouped with students who were on a different bus in the past. Currently our buses are full. We



have many new registrants at the school this fall and if those students live beyond the threshold then they have been put on a bus. This means that change requests that may have been granted previously, might not be possible for the future. We have sent our new registrant information to the Transportation Department along with our recommendation of which route and stop new students should be on. However, ultimately there may be reasons why the Transportation Department may need to alter those placements.

Students who reside in bounds of their school of attendance and are within walking distance to school may apply for courtesy transportation. Please be patient with this process. Availability of seats will be determined after September 30. Therefore, your child will not be entitled to travel on the bus until this time. Once we have ensured that our new registrants who live beyond the threshold are on the proper route, then, and only then, will we be able to ascertain whether or not change requests and courtesy rider requests are possible.

Courtesy transportation is assigned on an annual basis. Requests for Courtesy Transportation must be submitted to HWDSTS by the parent/guardian each year using Courtesy Transportation Request form.

Transportation may be granted if all of the following conditions are met:

- 1. A seat is available on the bus.
- 2. The bus stop already exists.
- 3. The bus route and the length of the trip are not affected.
