Safe & Timely Arrival

For the safety of all our students, we ask that you carefully read the following :

- Parking in the “School Bus Zone” and NO STOPPING zone is prohibited. Otherwise, parking is permitted on Sanatorium. West 33rd is your best option for drop off.
- There is **NO** stopping or parking in the Staff lot in front of the school. There have been close calls with staff and students almost getting hit.
- Watch very carefully as you drive around the school area. Extreme care needs to be taken in this area as well as at the surrounding crosswalks.
- The back playground is supervised from 8:30 to 8:45 and 3:05 to 3:20. **The play structure area is not supervised.**
- Punctuality continues to be important as most teachers will be starting with the “Literacy Block” or Math Block as soon as students enter. Please make every effort to have your child in line at the back playground by 8:45 a.m.
- Should you have something that needs to be discussed with the classroom teacher or another staff member, please write a note in your child’s agenda or call the office and we will record your request and give it to your child’s teacher.
- School ends at 3:05 p.m. Students will exit by their assigned door onto the back playground. Parents/caregivers/siblings will meet their child at the playground.
- Please call the school when your child will be absent, even if it is a “holy day”. This helps Ms. Millar, our office administrator and helps us know that your child is safe.
- Please call the school or send in a note when your contact information changes.
- Your cooperation in making Holbrook a safe community for all students is appreciated!

Planning for success:

Often parents will ask what can they do to set the tone for a new school year to help maximize their child’s success. Here are some suggestions that may help as you begin the new school year:

- Always be positive when speaking to your child about school. If they sense that you didn’t like school, they are likely to adopt the same attitude.
- Check out how you can be involved in school activities. If you are involved, your child will see your excitement and be excited too!
- Communicate regularly with your child’s teacher.
- Establish bedtime routines on school nights. Children require approximately 10 hours of sleep a night to be alert and attentive during school.
- Establish morning routines that include a nutritious breakfast and timely arrival at school. Students arriving late miss important lessons and instructions that cause them to fall behind.
- Establish homework routines on school nights. If no homework has been assigned, play math games, be active, read, read, read.
- Most importantly, talk to your child about school. Ask “What was your favourite part about your school day?” Asking further questions helps your child practice how to answer questions fully. These conversations lets them know you are interested in their school day and value their school experience.

School Cash Online



School Cash On-Line: It's easy and convenient!

School Cash Online is an easy to use and safe way to pay for your children's school fees. Now, with a few clicks, you can pay for your child's yearbook, class trips and so much more from your own home. All you have to do is register an account, attach your children and in no time you will be able to make payments online. School Cash Online is available at all HWDSB schools.

School Cash Online is an on-line payment service offered through the KEV

Group. The KEV Group is Canadian owned and operates its head offices in the Province of Ontario. There are over 9,000 schools using KEV's solutions for managing school bookkeeping across North America.

The School Cash Online website is certified compliant with Payment Card Industry (PCI) Data Security Standards. School Cash Online does not share personal information with any third party. They do not store credit card information

on their own web servers, computers or other devices. With the exception of funds loaded into MyWallet, your payment information must be entered every time you checkout.

The KEV Group uses Moneris as the payment processor. Moneris is Canada's largest payment processor, processing over 3 billion credit and debit transactions every year.

Synervoice Calls

Synervoice are automated calls that come to the primary phone number listed on your contact verification form.

Attendance is completed by the classroom teacher. This information is submitted to Ms. Millar. By 9:20 a.m. the attendance is entered.

If your child is absent for a known reason, Ms. Millar will enter that onto the computer. You will not receive a synervoice call

as the reason for the absence is known. However if the reason is unknown, or if the student is late, the computer synervoice system will call the primary number.

Synervoice may also be used by the principal to make important announcements or reminders. For example, I called to let the community know about the construction in the area. It would be helpful if you would please listen to the message first instead of

immediately calling the school to find out who called from the school. There are several phones in the building and Ms. Millar is not aware of each person who has called home.

We do want you to contact us with concerns. However listening to the message first will help reduce the number of calls Ms. Millar has to navigate. Thank you for your understanding.
