Supporting Literacy

January 27, 2018 was Family Literacy Day. All across Canada, families were encouraged to celebrate by taking part in activities to promote literacy.

Taking time every day to read or do a learning activity with children is crucial to a child's development. Even just 15 minutes a day can improve a child's literacy skills dramatically. An interesting research study states: A student who reads 20 minutes each day will read 3600 minutes in a school year and by the end of Grade 6 will have read the equivalent of 60 whole school days! That enriches vocabulary, comprehension and overall thinking skills!

At Holbrook, we celebrated Family Literacy Day by having our "Snuggle Up and Read" event, an assembly kicking off our Read-a-thon and had a guest author, Cindy Stewart. Mrs. Stewart"s book, "Lewy Kablooey and Sneezy Cheezy, teaches the importance of kindness and gives a message against bullying. She met with all classes and read her book and had activities for the children to participate in. Thank you, School Council, for funding this event.

Thank you to all the adults that came to read and to the older students for sharing with the younger ones. Pictures will be posted to celebrate "Snuggle Up and Read".

To help encourage reading, once again, we are holding a "Read-a-thon" with an Olympic theme. This is an exciting way to encourage your child to read. The comics, the newspaper, instructions to toys, recipes, magazines are all fun ways to encourage reading. Prizes are given for every 15 units of reading. You may also want to support the school by having your child raise some funds to support the Library as they read (it is not a requirement for participating). Check out the fantastic front display case for our Olympic Read-a-thon! In the words of Dr. Seuss, "The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go." So read, read, read.

Term 1 Report Cards

On February 13th your child (Grade 1—6) will bring home their Term 1 Report Card. The Kindergarten, Communication of Learning will come home on February 15th. After reading the report card yourself, please take the time to review the report card with your child and complete the third and fourth pages of the report together.

Here are some hints to help parents and students understand and get the most out of their child's report card:

- Marks A mark of B-, B or B+ indicates the student is meeting the expectations of the Ontario Curriculum. This is the goal that all students should be shooting for. A mark of 80% or more (A) is very difficult to achieve. Students must demonstrate not only an in depth understanding of the curriculum, but must apply their knowledge in innovative and complex ways. If you child is achieving Bs, they are to be praised and commended for their good work.
- Comments Carefully read the teacher's subject

- comments to discover the recommended "next steps" for your child. These suggestions can be used to set goals for improvement.
- Learning Skills This is an important, yet often most overlooked part of the report card. In this section the teacher evaluates and comments on the student's study and social skills. These skills are important in all subject areas and in life itself.
- Pages 3 & 4 Portions of these pages are to be completed by the student and their parent. Here goals for improvement are determined and recorded. Page 4 is to be returned to your child's teacher. If you would like to meet with the teacher to discuss your child's progress, please check the appropriate box on this page to request an interview. This page is not to be used to record concerns about the school, its programs or staff.

If you continue to have concerns after speaking with the classroom teacher, please call the Principal so that we can continue to work towards solutions in any area of concern.
