

# Parent Guide for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Students

## Tips to Support Students in Distance Learning

We hope that the answers to common questions below and recommended resources support your child's auditory learning at home.

### WHEN AT HOME, WHEN SHOULD MY CHILD BE WEARING THEIR HEARING TECHNOLOGY?

- Children should wear their hearing devices during all waking hours.
- Having access to sounds in their environment will increase your child's incidental learning, which is very important to your child's social, cognitive and language development. For examples, incidental learning includes watching TV, listening to music and overhearing other's conversations.
- If your child resists wearing their hearing devices, combine wearing the devices with an activity your child loves and gradually increase the time worn each day.

### WHAT SHOULD MY CHILD'S HOME LEARNING ENVIRONMENT LOOK LIKE?

- Provide a quiet space for learning. If the environment is too noisy, your child may not be able to clearly hear all speech sounds. Check the room for distracting noises, such as a TV playing the background.
- Reduce reverberation (echo) with carpet on the floor, a tablecloth on the table and window curtains.
- Include visuals to help support your child's learning whenever possible. For example, always turn on closed captions when watching TV or watching videos, and use pictures to help younger children learn new vocabulary.
- If your child misses something in a conversation, resist the urge to say, "I will tell you later," or, "it's not important." It is important that your child have access to all information, even in informal conversations.

## HOW DO I CONNECT MY CHILD'S HEARING TECHNOLOGY TO MY CHILD'S COMPUTER OR IPAD?

- Do a quick check of your child's amplification before connecting to the FM system.
- Ensure the batteries are fresh and tubes and moulds are clear.
- Remember to charge all of your devices at the end of the day.

## WHAT SHOULD I BE DOING TO HELP IMPROVE MY CHILD'S SPEECH?

## WHAT CAN I DO TO CONTINUE TO SUPPORT MY CHILD'S SELF-ADVOCACY AT HOME?

- Teach your child how to clean and care for devices (e.g. store, reposition and check battery status).
- Teach your child from a young age the proper terms for their hearing equipment (i.e., cochlear implant has processors not "ears").
- Encourage your child to identify problems with their equipment.
- Encourage your child to ask for repetition/clarification if a message is not received/understood.
- Encourage older children to independently connect to technology.
- Integrate alerts into your child's life, such as an alarm clock, to foster independence.
- Have your child develop an "All about Me" pamphlet that includes their hearing information, technology used and useful tips that they can share with their teachers upon return to school.
