



- Educators communicate with parents in many ways



ENTRY


Our school day begins at **8:40 am**. Staff are on the playground for supervision 15 minutes prior, at 8:25. Kindergarten students enter from two different doorways at the back and side of our school.

NUTRITION BREAKS

We have 2 nutrition breaks daily. Our first nutrition break is at 10:20-11:00 am. Our second nutrition break is at 12:40-1:20 pm.

DISMISSAL

Our school day ends at **3:00 pm**. We dismiss about 10 minutes prior to that at **2:50** pm as we must dismiss each student to a parent/guardian.

Transportation

Hamilton-Wentworth Student Transportation Services (HWSTS)

- At HWDSB, student transportation is provided by Hamilton-Wentworth Student Transportation Services (HWSTS). HWSTS provides safe, effective and efficient transportation services to eligible students at HWDSB.
- IF your child is eligible for transportation (you live 1km or more away from the school) you will be notified by HWSTS during the summer. You do not have to put your child on the bus for September if you do not wish to; you may call the school at a later date to set up bussing.

INDEPENDENCE

Have your child practice doing these activities independently:

- Putting on and zipping up sweaters and coats.
- Putting on shoes.
- Fastening zippers and buttons on pants.
- Toileting (e.g. flushing the toilet, wiping and washing hands)
- Changing into clean clothes.
- Basic hygiene skills (e.g. using Kleenex, washing and drying hands, wiping their face).
- Opening and closing plastic containers, water bottles, juice boxes, etc.







Throughout the summer try the following with your child:

- Singing the ABC's, practicing identifying some letters.
- Recognizing and printing their name.
- Drawing and/or colouring pictures.
- Using scissors to cut paper or make crafts.
- Read on a regular basis.
- Answer and discuss their questions to explore learning and practice listening and taking turns speaking.







SHARING

Important skills to practice with your child:

- Use manners (e.g. not interrupting, turn-taking, saying *please* and *thank you*).
- Practice following instructions when asked.
- Practice problem solving skills (e.g. talking about a problem).
- Sharing materials and toys with a friend or sibling by taking turns.







SCHOOL ROUTINES

Routines are very important to help ensure success at home and school. When children know what to expect they are more likely to follow instructions and feel comfortable in their environment.

- Getting up in the morning.
- Getting dressed independently.
- Coming home after school.
- Checking backpacks and Important Bags.
- Bedtime routines.







MATERIALS

Your child will need the following items:


- Appropriately sized backpack (e.g. that can fit their lunch bag, change of clothes, library book and Important Bag)

- Please label EVERYTHING






