Messages to Students

Please help us ensure the safety of your child(ren) by following these few, simple guidelines:

- Arrangements for babysitting, after school activities and pickup times for appointments should be made outside of school hours and a notation made in the student's agenda. This will ensure that there is no confusion as to your message. This also provides your child's teacher with an opportunity to prepare your child for the lessons they will miss and, your child can feel secure in knowing what their day will hold.
- While we recognize that there are emergencies and unforeseen circumstances that necessitate a message being delivered to a student during the school day, please limit these messages to true emergencies. This will limit interruption to classes, help your child organize his/her day, and reduce the anxiety children feel when plans change unexpectedly. We are more than happy to help out in extenuating circumstances.
- Writing instructions in your child's planner ensures that your instructions are followed out exactly as you intend and eliminates confusion, misunderstanding and the possibility that your message does not reach your child.

If your child is a bus student and is not riding the bus home, please indicate this to the teacher who will then pass the message to the office. It is important for the teacher to know this as they are the ones that are dismissing your child. The office needs to know so they can be taken off the afternoon bus list. Call in's (not preferred) must be before 2 p.m.

Dropping Off Items

The main office at Janet Lee is a very busy place. Mrs. Harte works very hard and really cares about your children. In addition to her many office responsibilities, frequently throughout the day, you will see her attending to a variety of bumps and boo boos. One way that you can support us in the office is by ensuring that your child(ren) have all they need to support them at school before they leave in the morning, lunch, musical instruments, gym clothes, etc.
