Playground and Parking Safety

We appreciate your help in promoting safety procedures with regard to the flow of traffic and pedestrians in the parking lots and Kiss 'N Ride lanes. Please remember that if you need to stop in the morning, please use the parking lot farthest from the school. The other is reserved for staff. Thank you for respecting the BUS ONLY LANE at the front of the school. Cars are never permitted in the bus lane as this is also an Emergency Vehicles lane and therefore must be clear at all times in case of an emergency. In addition, please be aware that an **Accessible Parking Permit** is required to park in the two Accessible parking spots.

School yard supervision by school staff begins at 7:55 a.m. Students should not be arriving and entering the school yard areas prior to 7:55 a.m. as they are not supervised. If it is raining or too cold in the morning, bus students come through the front doors as they arrive and line up quietly outside their classroom. The "vested" teachers on duty in the morning will direct walking/driven students to enter the building through the side doors and also line up quietly outside their classrooms.

The last day of classes is **Friday March 13th.** Classes resume on **Monday, March 23rd**. We hope that you have a wonderful break with your loved ones!
