Parental Involvement

We wholeheartedly welcome volunteers in our classrooms, during nutrition breaks, and on educational excursions. If you're interested in contributing as a volunteer, kindly contact the office for volunteer forms and information about police check requirements.

Visiting the School

Should you need to visit the school premises, we kindly ask that you use the buzzer at the front door and report directly to the office.

We have two 40-minute nutrition breaks, please send snacks and drinks. Due to anaphylaxis allergies, peanuts and anything containing peanuts is prohibited.

Student Entry and Exit

Upon arrival, students are to proceed directly to the tarmac area, as staff supervision is concentrated there. For morning entry, students will line up on the tarmac. Students must leave the school premises promptly after dismissal, as supervision on the pavement area is available only from 3:00 to 3:15 pm. Specific classes have designated entry doors.

The first day, staff will be out on the playground to assist students with class assignments as needed and line up procedures. Pylons will be out to mark the location of lines for all classes.

Class Assignments

You can find out your child's teacher by login onto the Parent Portal beginning August 28. Many factors go into student placements. All placements are considered temporary until reorganization at the end of September. To balance enrolment often minor changes are required. This happens at all schools across the district.

Nutrition Breaks - Students will consume meals within their classrooms at designated workspace areas. Due to allergy concerns, sharing of food and beverages is not permitted. We encourage minimal waste and ask that students take leftover food home.

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If you would like to give your child permission to leave the school at second Nutrition Break (1:00 pm -1:40pm) you will need to complete the permission form in the Parent Portal. This is generally a privilege extended to all students. We ask that students do not leave at first Nutrition Break because attendance is NOT taken after first Nutrition Break. It is a safety concern because we are unable to account for attendance until after second Nutrition Break. Students are responsible for returning to school on time for period 7 at 1:40 pm. Food or drink is not to be brought back to the playground or into the school.

Hydration - While water fountains are accessible, we recommend students bring labeled water bottles and use the Hydration Station for refills. Sending filled water bottles in the morning helps avoid congestion.

Nutrition Programs

All nutrition programs follow a 'Grab and Go' model, with pre-packaged foods distributed by staff and student helpers to classrooms.

Electronic Devices

Guidelines for personal electronic devices will be communicated the first week of school to all students and shared with families. Electronic devices are not to be used during instructional time, unless directed by the teacher for educational purposes only. Students are not permitted to record videos or pictures of anyone without permission There are to be no electronic devices in the washrooms. Use of electronic devices are not permitted in the hallways, lockers or during transition times. Students are encouraged to leave their electronic device at home. However, if your student must bring a cell phone to school for safety or personal reasons, they are to be out of sight. Students are solely responsible for the security of their devices. If you need to communicate with your child through the day, please call the school and we will facilitate this through the office.
