Expectations of Behaviour

Assemblies Everyone is to enter and leave the gym quietly. Respectful audience skills will be demonstrated by silently

watching the presentation. Appreciation will be shown through applause only.

Bullying Bullying is typically a form of repeated, persistent, and aggressive behaviour directed at an individual or

individuals that is intended to cause (or should be known to cause) fear and distress and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self esteem, or reputation. Bullying occurs in a context where there is real or perceived power imbalance. Bullying can take many forms such as physical, verbal, social and electronic/cyber. Bullying

will be subject to discipline.

Communication Regular communication between the home and the teacher is key to your child's success. Communication will

occur in a variety of forms. This may include agendas, email, websites, newsletters, phone calls and meetings.

entry.

Entry and Dismissal

In order to maintain the safest environment possible for our students, parents/guardians who accompany their child to school should drop their child off on the playground and wait for their child outside at dismissal.

School begins at 8:40. Students are to enter and leave the building through assigned doors. Students arriving more than 10 minutes late are to report to the office prior to joining their class. Student absences due to appointments, illness or other reasons require written or verbal notification by the parents/guardians.

All visitors are to report to the office to sign in and out when entering and leaving the building.

Hallways Keep to the right. Speak in a quiet voice. Walk. No eating in the hallways.

Manners We will communicate in a respectful manner using appropriate language. Swearing is unacceptable. Gum

chewing is not allowed at school.

Medication All medication is to be dispensed by the office staff. Students with puffers and epi pens are required to have

these items with them at all times.

Nutrition Break Inside:

Lunches are to be eaten in assigned lunchrooms. Students must talk quietly, remain seated and clean up after

themselves. Students must ask permission from the duty teacher to leave the lunchroom.

<u>Outside:</u>

For safety purposes, students must ask permission from the duty teachers before reentering the building.

Students leaving the school property to eat must do so at second nutrition break. Parental (written) permission is required to leave the school property. Notes are to be given to the homeroom teacher prior to daily

attendance.

Playground Play safely and fairly. Rough, unsafe activities are not allowed. Snow stays on the ground.

Property Keep your belongings neat and clean. Respect the belongings of others. Show proper care and regard for our

school building and community.

Technology Students may use their cellphone outdoors during nutrition breaks. At all other times, cellphones must be turned

off and put away. Classroom phones are available to call home if the need arises, with permission from the classroom teacher. Personal games or music devices are permitted during nutrition breaks in the lunchroom or outside only. Taking pictures or any forms of audio and/or video recordings using any electronic device is

strictly prohibited.

Please note: The school is not responsible for loss or damage to any personal electronic devices. Teachers may give permission to students to use these electronic devices during instructional time for learning purposes.
