We make every effort to place students in classes where they will have the greatest opportunities for success. Both teacher and parent input into placement decisions is welcomed.

Each June, we meet with teachers to build classes for the following year. Keeping a balance of gender, ability, and learning styles in a classroom is not always easy. When teachers meet with us to build classes, they provide information about student learning and contribute to the decision-making process. This is not an easy process. When requests for class changes are made at a later date, they can be very difficult and often impossible to accommodate as moving one student mid-year has a domino effect upon the placement of other students.

Parents should submit written requests (clacroix@hwdsb.on.ca) for class placement no later than May 31st. Although we shall try to honour these requests, it is not always possible to do so.
