If your child is four or turning four before December 31st, you may register him/her for Kindergarten. Please register online at http://www.hwdsb.on.ca/kindergarten/ and our office administrator will call you to make an appointment once we receive your application from the Board. Appointments will be booked Monday to Friday between 9:30-11:30 and 1:30-3:00. If you are not available during those times, we will do our best to accommodate your needs. You will need to provide proof of address (Tenancy Agreement, Proof of Purchase of home or Property Tax Bill); birth certificate and health card. All immunization records will need to be given to Public Health directly by the parents.

Severe Weather Conditions

Severe weather across the District or in any part of the District may result in the cancellation of transportation services to the entire District. If the weather is severe enough, the General Manager of the Hamilton-Wentworth Student Transportation System will advise the Director or Designate of the road conditions and weather conditions. The Director of Education or Designate will then decide whether or not to cancel all school and board administrative operations. If the conditions are determined to be unsafe, The Director of Education or Designate will then inform Corporate Communications and the General Manager of Hamilton-Wentworth Student Transportation System of the cancellation of all school and board administrative operations. Corporate Communications will inform the community by contacting the media, the City of Hamilton, school-based child care providers and by posting cancellation information on the website and on a School Cancellation "Hotline". Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV)

Ontario has shared news of four confirmed cases of the Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV).

Health officials anticipated these first cases and the overall risk to Ontario is considered low. As student and staff safety is a primary concern for Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board, we will continue to monitor the situation through local, provincial and federal partners and communicate with families as necessary.

Members of the public are advised by the Ministry of Health to take the usual measures to reduce the risk of transmission of the flu and respiratory illness.

Our families, students and staff should:

- •Get a yearly influenza vaccination, available from clinics and pharmacies (for flu only);
- Wash your hands frequently and thoroughly with soap and water or use an alcohol-based sanitizer;
- •Cover your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze;
- •If you don't have a tissue, sneeze or cough into your sleeve or arm; and
- •If you or your family members are ill, stay home.

Students and staff are not permitted to wear masks at school – if you are ill, please stay home:

As a school board, we depend on the expertise of health agencies, who have not recommended that healthy members of the public wear masks.

"Wearing masks when you are well is not an effective measure. Sometimes it can actually present some risks, as you are putting your fingers up and down on your face, removing your mask, putting them next to your eyes," Dr. Teresa Tam, Chief Public Health Officer of Canada has said.

Masks can also heighten anxiety.

Heightened Concern:

Events like this can cause feelings of uncertainty and anxiety. Here are some tips to support our community at this time:

- Be patient with yourself and those close to you.
- Take care of yourself.
- Eat healthy, drink plenty of water, and get enough rest.
- If you are feeling overwhelmed, consider taking a break from the news and social media.
- Provide children with age-appropriate factual information.
