- ✓ are applying to a System Program, OYAP, or Mohawk Bridge

# HWDSB RETURNING GRADE 12 STUDENTS



## ***Returning Grade 12 Students MUST:***

- ✓ be FULL TIME students
- ✓ have graduated with no more than 31 credits, including upgrades
- ✓ **Complete a 5<sup>th</sup> Year Form**
- ✓ Post Graduate students returning for Semester 1 only must take a minimum of 3 courses
- ✓ Students still working towards graduation and who may be returning for both semesters must take a minimum of 3 courses per semester

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## STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT RETURNING

- Grade 12 students who are not returning **MUST** hand in a sign-off sheet and enter the **NOTRET** option into Career Cruising

# HWDSB CO-OP OPTIONS



- 2 credit (half day) COO308
- 4 credit (full day) COOFT1 or COOFT2
- 110 hours/credit required
- Requires application and interview
- System Placements
  - Some competitive, board-wide placements
    - Police, Cable 14, Hospitals
    - Require interview and additional application
- System Programs
  - ArtSmart, Building Careers from the Ground Up, Caring for Our Future (Healthcare), Growing Careers (Horticulture), Limeridge Community Co-op, Military Co-op, Ontario Public Service
  - Require interview and additional application

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## ONTARIO YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

- Start your chosen career and train as a registered apprentice while enrolled in high school
- On the job training for students who like to learn by doing
- Signed apprentice = Paid employment + 4 credits + apprenticeship hours
- Over 130 careers including Early Childhood Educator, Chef, Carpenter, Electrician, Hairstylist etc.
- See a Cooperative Education Teacher for info

## ELEARNING OPTIONS

- There are over 100 elearning options being offered for the 2019/2020 school year
- All elearning courses can be chosen through Career Cruising
- Elearning courses are best suited for students who are well organized, motivated and can be successful with minimal supervision
