Admission Requirements

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), or equivalent including the following required course(s):

- ✓ English – any Grade 12 (C) or (U), or equivalent
- ✓ Biology – Grade 11 (C) or (U) or Grade 12 (U)
- ✓ Chemistry – Grade 11 (U) or Grade 12 (C) or (U) **OR**
Physics – Grade 11 (U) or Grade 12 (C) or (U)

Recommended Courses and/or Skills:

Pre-Admission Requirements

As part of the admissions process some programs have pre-admission requirements.

- ✓ Pre-admission testing - Completion of the Health Occupations Aptitude Exam (HOAE)
- ✓ A full Class G driver's licence is required by August 1st, 2021

Selection and Ranking

For competitive programs—where the number of qualified applicants exceeds the available places—selection will be based on the most senior level final grade available in required courses at the time of ranking. Mid-term grades are not used for ranking purposes. Testing or other supplemental evaluation may be required.

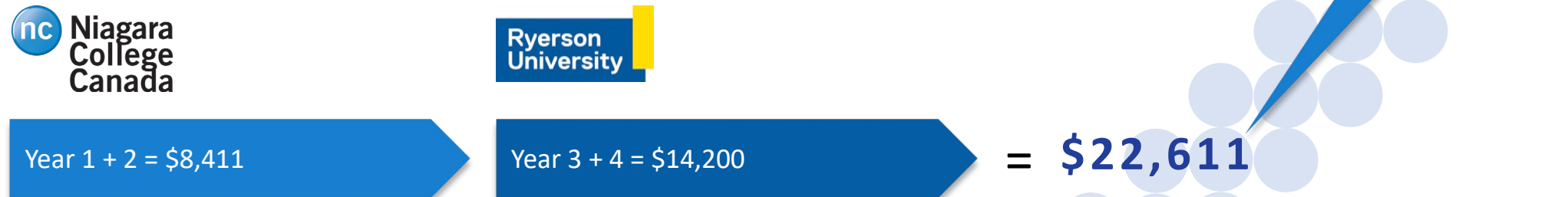
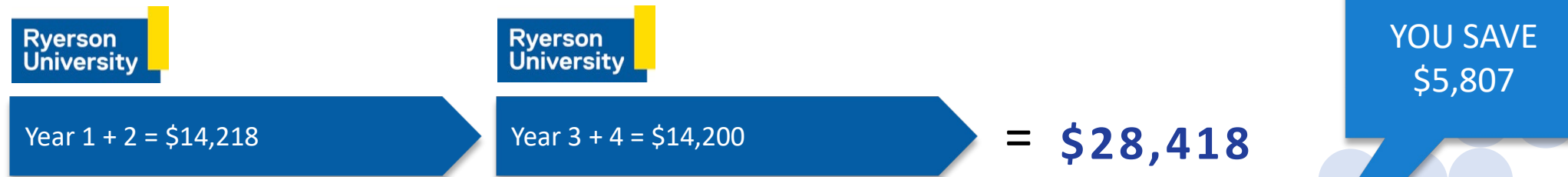


SOME COLLEGE-TO-UNIVERSITY PATHWAYS CAN SAVE YOU MONEY

- **Time manage!** Set aside 1-2 hours per week; ensure you don't neglect your homework & exams. Meet the application deadlines and keep copies of your applications & submissions.
- **Proffreed!** cheque you're speling and grammer!
- **Apply to more than one!** You might be the only one who applied!
Getting one can increase your chance of getting others.
Don't overlook the smaller amounts, they often have fewer applicants.
