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CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS

The Ontario Secondary School Certificate is a pathway for some students and can also be granted on request to students who leave school before earning the Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The requirements for an OSSC are:



Ontario Secondary School Certificate (O.S.S.C.) Requirements

In order to graduate high school with an Ontario Secondary School Diploma, students will need:

√ 14 credits (7 compulsory, 7 elective)

Ontario Secondary School Certificate of Accomplishment

Granted to students who are not taking the OSSD or OSSC pathway. The Certificate of Accomplishment may be a useful means of recognizing achievement for students who plan to take certain kinds of further training, or who plan to find employment directly after leaving school.

Listed at the top of your next year's list will be your compulsory/required courses. These are courses like English, Math, and Science.


Underneath your compulsory courses are spaces to choose your elective/optional courses.
