



COMMUNITY HOURS



- For 2022/2023 graduates the number of required community involvement hours is 40 hours
- Activities that take place during the school day can be counted (e.g., walking a younger neighbour or sibling to and from school, helping younger siblings with their homework)
- Activities can include up to 10 hours of paid work
- Activities that consist of duties normally performed in the home count for hours (e.g., students could help an elderly relative with errands, provide after-school care for a sibling, etc.)





 A pathway is a route through secondary school that leads to a specific destination.


 It can also be a combination of courses that provide students with a specific, defined set of skills and knowledge.
