Beginning April, parents will have additional methods of reporting their child's absence via a website or app. More information will be coming to families shortly.


#### Mary Hopkins Morning Drop Off and Kiss & Ride Starts April 1st

Many school communities struggle with traffic and safety at drop off and pick up. We understand that parents often feel the pressure of time and their commitments in the morning, however we remind you that safety is always a top priority.

Beginning April 1, we will be introducing a morning Kiss and Ride drop-off from 8:55 am - 9:10 am each day for Grade 1-5 students. Look for the pylons to indicate the safe drop off area and follow the procedures outlined below.

This option is not available for our Kindergarten students, as dropped off and pick up must be directly to and from the class-room educators. Parents who need to walk their child to the school or school yard, must use street parking.

Please remember that families should not be parking or walking through our lot from 8:40 am - 3:45 pm.



### **DOGS ON SCHOOL PROPERTY**

With the nicer weather, many families may see pick up or drop off as an opportunity to give the family dog some fresh air. However, please be reminded that some caregivers and children are very afraid of dogs, while other children show no fear and approach dogs with no hesitation. It is for these reasons that dogs should not be on the school grounds during the school day, or during admission or dismissal when large numbers of children are around. We ask for your cooperation in this matter and ask you to leave your pet at home.
