

Terminology is important when a situation impacts the safety of students and staff. Schools, police and media outlets use four specific terms during such events.

The term **LOCKDOWN** must be used appropriately and leave no misunderstanding as to what is expected.

	<h2>LOCKDOWN</h2> <p>Potentially serious violent situation at the school that would endanger the lives of staff and students. Usually police initiated.</p>	REMAIN IN SCHOOL
	<h2>HOLD & SECURE</h2> <p>Safety situation in the neighbourhood not related to the school.</p>	
	<h2>SHELTER IN PLACE</h2> <p>Potential environmental or weather-related hazard outside the school.</p>	
	<h2>BOMB THREAT</h2> <p>Report or discovery of an explosive device.</p>
