- 3) Treasurer's Report:
 - N/a
- 4) Principal's Report:
 - Term 1 reports: email/text link sent out to access via Parent Portal. School only received around 4-5 calls, which might indicate this is a better delivery for reports? Less paper, easier to retrieve...
 - Covid-19 screening protocols: always refer to the <u>provincial site</u> for most up to date information and daily school screening requirements: these are frequently updated
 - Part 1 presentation (framework) on HWDSB anti-racism/anti-oppression curriculum (<u>Learn. Disrupt. Rebuild</u>) Please see <u>Slide Dec</u>. March School Council will look at classroom material, what this curriculum looks like IN the classroom
 - Co-learning stance: there are no experts in this, we are all learning together, with the children too. When unpacking with kids, equal does not mean fair: we don't all come from the same places/experiences
 - Not racist = innactive state; Anti-racist = proactively taking steps to ensure racism is not present. We need to be proactive; we can't just sit and wait for a complaint. We need to ensure inclusivity is present, and that there are no barriers for students
 - Foster an equitable and inclusive environment for **anyone** who comes in to the school, so that they feel included
 - As seen in the Land Acknowledgement slide of the *Learn. Disrupt. Rebuild* slide dec, Wampum belts are now in every HWDSB school. Classes can request to borrow these,

and students learn about <u>Wampum belts</u>, as well as the <u>Dish With One Spoon</u> concept, so that classes have a frame of reference for the Land Acknowledgement

- 5) Staff Report:
 - For students returning to in-school learning, Ms. Buck heard repeatedly how much kids enjoyed time with their families; Ms. Black notes that this is the first transition from remote to in-school, and other than some tired kiddos and little bit of an up & down start, it's been really nice to be back! The snow has been amazing, the social aspect great for everyone
 - Question for in-class staff: why are windows opened throughout the day?
 - Air flow, fresh air, as masks must be worn all day
 - There have been no noted concerns, kids are comfortable, but staff are conscious to respond to a child who MAY be uncomfortable
 - As a reminder, please either dress children in layers, or pack some in bag
- 6) New Business:
 - Snow removal: City of Hamilton responsible for sidewalks; Contractors, for parking lot; Caretaker for pathways from parking lot into school, sidewalks into entry points
 - Plan for next year for the blacktop, <u>before</u> ice/scnow build up? Quotes for snow removal... can School Council cover this, once we are fundraising again?
 - Safety concerns regarding (crossing) the corner of Mill and Elgin who can help? School? City? Trustee? How do we get crossing guards in a neighbourhood?
