

Principal's Message

With warmer and sunnier days upon us, I reflect on our continued growth as a school community. As principal I take great pride in the sense of community we have built within our school and the warm, welcoming environment we have created for both current and future families that walk through our doors. As Mary Hopkins educators, our goal is to provide a safe, supportive and cooperative place of learning for all of our students. An environment where we celebrate our student diversity and develop a climate of respect, while encouraging our students to continuously strive for their personal best.

I am also a firm believer that the parents and guardians of our students play an equally important role in every child's learning experience. I encourage parents and guardians to be active participants in the daily learning activities and school experiences of their children. The trick is to ask about things that are specific, but still open-ended. Move beyond "fine" and "nothing" by asking your child to describe their world. It's also great to start the conversation with an anecdote from your own day. Try one of these conversation-starters:

- 1. Tell me about the best part of your day.
- 2. What was the hardest thing you had to do today?
- 3. Tell me about what you read in class.
- 4. Who did you play with today? What did you play?
- 5. Can you show me something you learned (or did) today?

While the slower paced days of summer beckon us, we are mindful of the significance of this last stretch of the school year. A time when new learning is consolidated, areas of challenge revisited and student inquiry ignited. We appreciate your support in ensuring that students attend regularly, arriving on time for the start of the instructional day.

Spring weather comes with its own challenges at school. We recognize the benefits that daily exercise, fresh air and the opportunity to socialize with peers has on student well being, engagement and learning. Please note that students will go outside for recess, DPA, entry and dismissal even in light drizzle. We will remain indoors during inclement weather (e.g., active thunderstorm, heavy rain, extreme temperatures, etc.) Parents, please remind your children to wear boots on rainy or muddy days and have a pair of indoor shoes, if possible. Just like at home, we do not want outdoor shoes tracking in mud. Please remember to label your children's items for easy identification. Students are encouraged to check our Lost and Found for any missing/lost items.

Visitors to Mary Hopkins

Throughout the instructional day, access to our building is limited to students and staff of the HWDSB. To assist us in ensuring the safety of all:

- Enter through the front door only, unless specified (i.e., presentation in our gymnasium)
- Make sure to buzz the office before entering, as doors are locked
- Report to the office and sign in
- Have a classroom visit pre-arranged with the teacher, school educator or staff, typically outside of instructional time
- Not enter the hallways or classrooms without prior authorization
- Not allow others to catch the entry door to avoid the risk of students/adults not checking in at the office

Daily Attendance Reminders

If your child is going to be absent, needs to be picked up early, or will be coming into school late, please make sure to record that information in Safe Arrival. Planned absences can be put in as far in advance as you are able. Same day absences, however, need to be put in the system by 10 a.m. for the system to pick them up.

Please note, while office and school staff do our best to call down children for early pick up, at times this can take some time for the student to actually arrive at the front door. Please also note that early pick ups result in the disruption of learning to your child and to the other students in the class, particularly the 3:00 to 3:30 pick-ups. Please consider these factors when determining when/if to pick your child up early.
