

Volunteer opportunities are available throughout the school year at Millgrove in the classroom and school.

Volunteer opportunities include a winter food drive collection for a community charity; a Read-a-thon in January to coincide with Literacy Week; a book fair in May to coincide with our open house; activities such as the Terry Fox Run and cross-country running; hanging student art work, checking-in and re-shelving library books; organizing the book cart for book exchange; helping staff with classroom tasks such as visual art prep; copying, cutting and pasting resources for students; reading with students; organizing / counting out community brochures, notices, etc. to go home with students and administrative tasks.

Please note that a vulnerable sector screening (police check) is required. Many of these volunteer opportunities take an hour or so, while others may require more of a time commitment. We can always find something that will suit your schedule.

How To Complete a Vulnerable Sector Screening:

- After receiving your police clearance, show the original to the principal to review. Keep the original document, which is valid for three years.
- Each year, your school principal will ask you to complete an Offence Declaration form to declare any Criminal Code convictions since the last Vulnerable Sector screen.
- Provide two references that you permit the school to contact.
- Once accepted, complete an orientation training session with the Principal.
