### Teacher's Report - Alison Mason

**Mrs. DiToro – Kindergarten:** Excited to be able to share our digital book for visitors inspired by author/illustrator Christian Robinson "You Matter".

**Mrs. Bailey – Kindergarten:** In the middle of Animal Inquiry. Lots of fun learning! Student teacher Ms Heslop finishes on Friday.

Mrs. Frizell Grade 1: No update

Mrs. May - Grade 1/2: In Language working on main idea and penpal letters. In Math working

on money/coins and in Science working on animals and living things.

Mrs. Price – Grade 2/3: In Language working on Persuasive Letters from point of view. Reading our stories to the other classes. In Math working on linear measurement/area/perimeter and in Social Studies Grade 2s are working on Global Communities and Grade 3s are working on Communities in Ontario.

**Mrs. Dahmer – Grade 3:** In Language working on Inferencing and using evidence from the text to support our answers. In Math working on time and money. In Social Studies working on our projects "Living and Working"

Mrs. Leach – Grade 4: In Language, April is Poetry Month. We'll be learning about various forms of poetry and writing and publishing our own Poetry books by the end of the month. Book Talks have also begun. In Social Studies, working on Ancient Civilizations. Ms. Elgersma is doing a wonderful job teaching this unit. An exciting "home project" will be sent home soon to showcase our learning at the end of the month. Students are also beginning their own research projects on their research question of choice. In Math finishing Probability and have made connections between fractions and probability which is great! 2D/3D geometry is up next! Eco Club is up and running! Hooray! Each class will be given a pot with seeds to nurture for the next couple of weeks and then we will plant them outside the week of Earth Day (April 19<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup>). We are planning a community clean up walk on Earth Day to make Millgrove beautiful.

**Mrs. Nedelko – Grade 5:** In math, working on geometry (measuring angles using a protractor and drawing and measuring triangles using a compass. In science working on human organ systems and constructing our own paper models. In Music working on recorders and sounding great but kids need to practice at home too.

**Mrs. Mason**: Introduced grades 1-5 to Gagaball, a safer form of Dodgeball. Working on Dance is grades 1-3 "if you can move, you can dance" and teaching different movements. In FDK working on centres. Jump Rope for Heart coming up! Dance Club and Air Band 2x per week.

**Empower**: approaching lesson 80, on track to finish in a good time. Reading groups are continuing with a focus on decoding awareness. IEPs, please return signed IEPs or call the

Regarding stumps, there are a few willing to donate, picture look blurry, appear to be soft wood.

The board prefers hard wood as soft wood rots quicker.

There was a request for paths. However this may be problematic with the lawn care contract

The plan is to have "pumpkin" size stones that would be a marker to indicate the terry fox route and could be painted

Rocks should be big and heavy to avoid students picking them up

Denise will check and confirm whether there is any issue with the lawn contract

Mrs. Mason will review the path and give approximate number of rocks

PVC piping for a music wall, will put out a request to see if any families have PVC piping that can be donated

### **School Spending Requests:**

- The quote for gagapit is quite high 1 quote came back at \$7000 and a 2<sup>nd</sup> quote came back at \$4300. The more expensive option is moveable and the less expensive is permanent. Ideally looking to put on the pavement. Balaclava has 2 of them and the stand up well to the weather so far.

Denise will check with Balaclava school to see what approvals are required for parents to build the gagapit.
