## Motion to Approve December 2022 Meeting Minutes:

## Principal's Report:

- The library has received a donation of navy chair and will be adding lkea stools. Will also be adding large pieces of paper and writing tools for the children.
- Progress reports will go home February $17^{\text {th }}$ in paper form to all families.
- School will be beginning to practice lockdown and shelter in place drills. Start on January
$25^{\text {th }}$ at noon and will roll one out per month.
- Encouraging a culture of high expectations at Millgrove (manners, please and thank you etc). Making small moves and the children are responding.
- Respond and Rebuild Document - focused on the world we live in (words such as bias, equity, racism etc). Will be using the "ism" words to define actions and language used and then using it as a teachable moment about "why" we shouldn't say or do that. The key is progressive discipline.
- Family Literacy Day is January $27^{\text {th }}$ (PA Day). The week leading up to the day school will be celebrating literacy and the "power of reading". Will also be using Barbara Reid resources and those linked to equity ("What is your Heritage").
- Setting up a staff library that will be accessible to staff. Will take donations of books.
- Also encouraging the ramping up of home reading and stretching literacy day into the entire week.


## Teacher's Report:

Mrs Bailey/Mrs Hayward - JK/SK - Tower inquiry - lots of learning around community. Shapes and measurement.

Mrs. DiToro/Mrs Coakwell - JK/SK - Working on a shape interest. We are learning to blend letters and exploring sounds through fun games.

Mrs. Frizell - Grade 1 -In Math working on data and then measurement. In language working on making connections and DRA. In science working on four seasons and the sun.

Mrs. May - Grade $1 / 2$ - In Math finishing up data management and moving on to measurement. In Language working on asking relevant questions as a reader and penpal letters. In Science, grade 1s are working on living things and grade 2s are working on animals.

Mr. Kimmerly - Grade 2/3 - Working on mental math and data management. Also working on reading comprehension, paragraph generating, decoding and the science of reading. In social studies working on people and environments, places and jobs in Canada.

Mrs. Dahmer - Grade 3 - In literacy working on descriptive writing and DRA. In math working on adding/subtracting, mental math and problem solving up to 1000. In Social Studies working on living in Ontario and an Inquiry Project. In health working on processed and unprocessed foods and oral health.

Mrs. Leach - Grade 4 - In language working on reading responses, a variety of read alouds, determining the author's message, finding proof in the text and Lexia project is underway. In Math working on data management and surveying the school for Kernels fundraiser. In health, working on healthy eating and vitamins and minerals.

Mrs. Nedelko - Grade 5 - In literacy/drama working on writing and reading about MLK, Reader's Theatre - March on Washington. In Math working on 2 digit by 2 digit - most have got it! Judging reasonableness of answers. In Science working on Physical and Chemical changes in matter. In PE working on Basketball.

Mrs MacCuish - French - Food truck unit starting. Historically loved by students.
Mrs. MacCuish - LRT - Lexis licenses in use in Grade 3/4. Empower continuing.
Mrs. Mason - Phys. Ed - Grade 1 - working on striking with hand. Grade 2 - understanding basic rules of game. Grade 3 - understanding fair play and elimination etiquette.
