Principal's Report:

Bell Let's Talk - spent a lot of Time and commitment around wellness including bell lets talk day. Student writing and artwork has been posted on the walls around the school

Announcements: There is a banner on the Millgrove website that is being updated every few days including the announcements. The school sign out front has been updated. At 10:20 the O' Canada is played daily.

Jungle sport: Thank you Allison for all of your support with jungle sport. Jungle sport is tentatively booked for next year for the week leading up to family day weekend 2024.

Term 1 report cards will go home this Friday in paper form. Updated IEPs will also be going home this week, requirement to be updated 3x per year.

Pink Shirt Day:Will be Feb 22nd. Mar. Kimerley's room will take leadership around pink shirt day.

Practice lockdown - hold and secure will be March 22nd at noon. Shelter in place test was successful. This will be included in the news feed, information will be shared with students in advance about the reason, location within the classroom and ensure quiet.

Open House: May 2nd 5-7pm Tuesday evening, Greensville open house will be the Thursday (4th). Book fair is booked. Optimist club has been contacted. A publisher will be in attendance and helping with the book fair. Air band will also be performing that evening.

Culture of High Expectations: Continuing to manage the culture here at Millgrove. Manners are getting better. Also managing interruptions, both verbal and non verbal interruptions Looking towards validation for next month.

Literacy: The hockey jersey book brought into T he grade 3 class, introducing students to things like privilege, poverty, skin colour,etc.

Oral Language: Word reading fluency, going back to phonics, decoding, long vowels, short vowels and determining for each class what the skill levels are. All teachers have copy of manual.

Jungle Sport:

\$9400 for 2 weeks

Previously council paid the deposit

Rural school funding paid for part \$1883

Students paid \$10 equating to \$1700 toward cost

Looking at rural schools funding for next year as well as outdoor/experimental funding to contribute to jungle sport in 2024

Teacher's Report:

Mrs Bailey/Mrs Hayward – JK/SK – Focus is starting UFLI targeted lessons. Students are still interested in towers. The dream center continues to be a veterinarian,

Mrs. DiToro/Mrs Coakwell – JK/SK – Starting UFLI lessons. Lots of talks about friendship. Making friendship soup (measuring, counting, adding)

Mrs. Frizell – Grade 1 –In math working on measurement (length, mass, area) and then money. In language working on phonics, making connections, and word families. In Science working on daily and seasonal changes – four seasons and the sun. Also revisiting bucket filling with kindness and listening.

Mrs. May – Grade ½ - In language working on inferring, UFLI reading intervention. In Science grade 1s are working on energy and grade 2s on animals. In math finishing measurement, length, mass and time.

Mr. Kimmerly – Grade 2/3 – In math working on probability and data. In language working on media, advertising, drama, phonics (vowel sounds). In science working on strong and stable structures and simple machines. Also working on listening skills and kindness.

Mrs. Dahmer – Grade 3 – In math working on measurement, length, perimeter, area. In literacy working on descriptive writing and phonics. In science working on structures. Starting music with hand bells and mood + music.

Mrs. Leach – Grade 4 – In language working on Black History month resources, read-a-louds and inferring continues. In math working on fractions, problem solving and daily number tasks. In science working on pulleys and gears – going to be designing and experimenting.

Mrs. Nedelko – Grade 5 – In Science working on Conservation of Energy/Renewable Resources versus non-renewable. In Math working on perimeter and area and next will be metric conversions. In Reading, starting a novel study using Literature Circle format.

Mrs MacCuish – French – Finished food trucks with a fun festival attended by the kindergarten students. Moving on to learning about French-speaking communities in Ontario and Quebec.
