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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

October 2014



September has come and gone, and we are now settling in to routines and students are engaged in great learning experiences! Re-organization at Mount Albion created a new JK/SK FDK classroom, and we welcome Ms. M. Kafouf as our newest Kindergarten classroom teacher! I have visited our newly formed classes a number of times already, and the children have settled in beautifully! The movement of students to different classes to balance out numbers from Grade 3/4 upward also went well. Thanks for your understanding and support during this time.

Our internal and external renovations for this year are almost complete....if your children use the "French and Art" room (room 10), then I'm sure that they have shared with you the new shelving that has just been installed. Just some finishing touches and adjustments to come at this point!

Thank you to those families who supported our fall fundraising campaign – we will publish the profits made in our next newsletter, when the numbers are finalized!!!

Once again, I need to remind parents about the very important protocol of parking, dropping and picking up children in both parking lot areas: When using either parking lot, please only use actual/designated parking spots. DO NOT park on hatched lines. DO NOT park along fences in the lower parking lot – especially the fence that runs alongside the Kindergarten entry doors. There simply is not enough space for you to leave your vehicle in these places without your creating a problem for other vehicles to drive around you. If you are stopping briefly, it would be to escort your child to the gate and pass them on to supervising staff, then quickly get back into your vehicle to drive away from that area. If you like to stay and wait with your child until the bell rings, then you must park in an actual parking spot only, or park on Kennard.



This applies to the end of the day as well. Once the parking lot is full, please find a spot on the road. In the upper parking lot area, please DO take advantage of the drop and go zone – but please be careful and pull right into the zone before stopping to drop off/pick up your children. The Fire Department and By-Law officers have confirmed that cars stopping at the "curve" but not fully pulling over into the "bay" may in fact be ticketed. Also, please be advised that parking in our wheelchair accessible parking spots – even for a few minutes – could also result in a substantial ticket! We certainly don't want this to happen. In the Drop and Go Zone – this area is designated as "stopping only" – therefore you must remain with your vehicle at all times. If you plan to "park" and vacate your vehicle to wait for your child on school property, please use a parking spot if open – or head out to the street and park where legal parking is permitted. If you have any questions about the parking areas, please do not hesitate to give me a call. And thank-you to everyone as we have learned to use these new areas in a way that keeps our children safe!

Next week we all celebrate Thanksgiving in our own ways. I am grateful for another year at Mount Albion where I can celebrate the opportunity of working with our wonderful students and this community!


