HALLOWEEN!!




INTERMEDIATE (grades 7-8): Our Halloween Dance is from 1:20—3:00 p.m. on the 31st! How SPOOKtacular!!

It is the policy of the HWDSB to contact parents in the event that the student does not arrive at school and the school has not been notified about an absence or late arrival.
