### **Guest Speakers:**

- Cam Galindo
  - Trustee, Wards 9&10
  - Involved with the politics and policies within the Ministry of Education
  - Acts as a liaison for the public/community
  - Would like to get more involved to get a feel for the need of the area and willing to help in any way he can
- Christine Nicolaides, Principal of Salt Fleet High School
  - Goal is to reach out to the feeder school, enhance the transition from elementary school to High School
  - School is 23 yrs old, new and up-coming constructions
    - New football and track field, to start in June 2019
    - \$63,000 from the Heritage Green Fund to build a new stage
    - \$20,000 new cafeteria tables
    - \$ 2,000,000: reno up-date to science labs
    - Sanded and refinished gym floor
  - Community Involvement:
    - Host OFSA: basketball
    - Host Special Olympics, elementary level
  - School
    - Improvement plan: focus: Math, has seen success
    - Approach to teaching using spiral method, layered knowledge
    - Specialist High Skills Majors:
      1. Information Communication Technology

### **Community Report:**

- Currently have 65 kids in aftercare

- March Break Camp: 86 kids signed up
- Summer Camp location: Janet Lee, allowed 110 children based on full time hours
- New Day Care
  - Constructions to begin June 2019, goal of completion Spring 2020
  - 3 classrooms: Infants, Toddlers, Preschool
  - Requires the hiring of 12 new staff members
  - Will perform gradual intake

### **Principal Report:**

- 475 students
- Improvement Plan
  - Improve Grade 6 math, seen overall improvement, still not hitting Provincial standards
  - Improve Grade 1 literacy, seen overall improvement, still not hitting Provincial standards
  - Increase overall graduation rates in high school on a yearly basis
- Renovation
  - Scheduled to start in May 2019, will start with the gym, then pulling down the partapaks in June
  - 2 Additional portable will be delivered
  - Intermediate classes to be moved to the portables and primary classes to be moved to the other end of the school building
  - Bus pick up and delivery will be redirected to the street: plans in the works
  - Prediction is that 2 portables will be
- School Trips
  - Concerns have been expressed about quality school trips
  - Looking to get more curriculum approved trips
  - Transportation continues to be an on-going issue, bus cost a significant amount of money making the trip too expensive in most cases
  - May need funds to assist with this cost
- Kindergarten registration to start in Feb, information session still in the works
- Open house on hold at this time due to construction plans

### **Teachers Report:**

- Talent show auditions to start soon
- Grade 4-6 floor hockey intramurals will be starting soon
- Sr Basketball has started and currently going well
- Grade 3-8 volleyball intramurals to be starting shortly

### **New & Old Business:**

- LunchLady
  - Launched Dec 19, 2018, a total of 67 meals ordered
  - Feedback has been positive
  - Profit: \$23.45
  - Council agreed to continue with the program, will offer 1 day/wk, aiming for Fridays, started Feb 1, and going X 6 wks, will reassess at that point
- Chocolate Fundraiser

- Launch off assembly moved to Jan22, 2019
- Chocolate delivery: Jan 31, 2019, Helpers: Amber/Stephanie/Stacey
- Distribution to the classes Feb 1/2019, Helpers: Amber & Victoria
- Letters/permission forms to be ready to take home by Jan 22/19
- Agreed to trial school cash online as a payment option
- Prizes:
