March Events:

By now I am sure you are aware that March Break has been moved to April. Our student council has decided that we should infuse some fun into our school this month by celebrating March Madness. We are hoping to see the new gym and the Child Care Centre completed by the end of June. The new bus drop off zone and upper parking lot will help alleviate much of the congestion we have on Kennard at the beginning and the end of each school day.

SCHOOL COUNCIL NEWS



Greetings Mount Albion Families,

The parent council met virtually on February 18, 2021. Construction is coming along at the school and the addition of the south end of the building is now completed. Many classes have moved inside the school from the portables at the rear of the building. Based on our current projections, 3 portables will remain on the property. The construction continues at the front of the school on the new gymnasium and daycare program rooms. The changerooms have already been completed with new facilities and sinks.

Summer daycare camp forms will be distributed for those needing care. Enrollment in camp will run in full week time blocks. Summer camp will be offered to students already enrolled in the aftercare program but may be open to all students dependant on enrollment number. Summer camp will be housed at Janet Lee school due to the construction at Mount Albion this year.

A major safety concern was noted during pick up and drop off times. Please exercise patience while dropping and picking up students at the front of the building as this area has become very congested due to construction and buses loading on street and snowbanks on both sides of the road. Please note that the lower parking lot is not for pick up and drop off and be aware of no-stopping areas on Kennard Street. We also ask parents to be mindful of students crossing the road or getting into or out of vehicles as well as respecting our neighbours by not blocking driveways. Thank you so much for everyone's participation in making sure that our students and staff are safe.



My Favourite Children's Book

My favourite book to read has always been ***Madeline*** by Ludwig Bemelmans. This book was originally published in 1939 and is beautifully illustrated with paintings of real Parisian landmarks. The books all begin the same way: "In an old house in Paris that was covered in vines, lived twelve little girls in two straight lines, the smallest one was Madeline". Delightfully written in rhyme, this book follows the story of Madeline who ends up needing an appendectomy. I loved this story because Madeline was a feisty heroine with lots of bravery. I also liked that this book had a special "badge" on the front cover which meant that it was a good one! The *badge* is the Caldecott Medal, awarded to the most distinguished American picture book for children of the year. Maybe your children will enjoy this enduring classic too!





HWDSB uses an application process for entry into French Immersion for children born in 2015.

A Grade 1 system-wide application process for entry to French Immersion allows for program placement of students, monitoring of accommodations, balance of enrolment, and long-term stability of the French Immersion program.

We guarantee an offer of placement within the French Immersion program to all applicants – not necessarily the neighbourhood school.

Please take note of the important dates:

Monday, November 30, 2020	Application process opens for Senior Kindergarten students
Sunday, January 24, 2021	Deadline for applications
Friday, February 26, 2021	Program location offered to Parent/Guardian
Friday, March 12, 2021	Deadline for program acceptance

Please note: Families with an older sibling currently in French Immersion are still required to complete an online application for the new student.
