







## Welcome to Mount Albion!











At Mount Albion there are 4 kindergarten classrooms. One class of 15 students has one educator and three classes of 29 students have 2 educators, a Registered/Designated Early Childhood Educator and an Ontario Certified Teacher. ## What Does a Day in Kindergarten Look Like?



#### A Typical Day Includes:

Every classroom will look a bit different and has their own schedule but a day in kindergarten will have a variety of engaging learning activities that the teachers and DECEs create for students, based on their students' interests and learning goals.

- •A morning carpet routine
- Daily read-aloud stories
- Table top activities where students make a choice from a selection of activities of their interest
- Blocks of play, both indoors and outside (weather permitting)
- Building challenges
- Sensory activities (water table, play dough, etc.)
- Singing songs
- Several bathroom breaks
- •Short, whole class lessons at the carpet
- •1:1 time with educators and small group instruction
- Visits to the gym and library on a weekly basis

## The Four Frames of the Kindergarten Program



Children learn through play, inquiry and exploration in the classroom and outdoors. We believe that young children are curious, competent and capable of complex thinking. We are committed to providing high quality programming that will nourish each child's academic, social and emotional development and prepare them for success in school and in life.

In Kindergarten, your child will build their knowledge and experiences in four key areas of learning: Belonging and Contributing, Demonstrating Literacy and Mathematics Behaviours, Problem Solving and Innnovating and Self-Regulation and Well-Being.



## The Four Frames of the Kindergarten Program



**Belonging and Contributing**: Children are connected to others and play an important role in contributing to various groups, the wider community and the world around them. For example, they begin to have an awareness of themselves as dramatists, actors, dancers, artists and musicians through engagement on various activities in the arts.

**Demonstrating Literacy and Mathematics Behaviours**: Children think critically about the world around them and communicate their literacy and mathematical thinking and learning in different hands-on experiences. Children will learn beginner reading skills and early numeracy skills.



## The Four Frames of the Kindergarten Program



**Problem Solving and Innnovating**: Children make meaning of the world around them by observing, questioning, planning, exploring, testing theories and solving problems. Problem-solving activities provide opportunities to explore, create, communicate, and ask questions while developing small and gross motor skills. For example, building with blocks develops problem-solving and spatial-reasoning skills which are connected to science and other subjects.

**Self-Regulation and Well-Being**: Children develop a sense of self-awareness and an understanding of the importance of physical and mental health and wellness. Self-Regulation or social emtional learning involves communicating, reading and writing. For example, when children are playing in dramatic play and role-playing children build negotiation skills and empathy.

- We look forward to welcoming your child at Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board!


